Palm Desert, CA – The McCallum Theatre announces an addition to its 2024 Spring line-up. **Och & Oy: A Considered Cabaret**, starring famed British stage and screen actor **Alan Cumming** and longtime NPR *All Things Considered* host **Ari Shapiro**, will play one night only at the McCallum Theatre on Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 PM.

Alan Cumming and Ari Shapiro may seem like an odd couple, but the two friends are both storytellers who seek to help audiences better understand themselves and the world around them.

Born of an impromptu collaboration on stage at one of Shapiro's solo shows, **Och & Oy: A Considered Cabaret** is an evening of songs and stories with a tongue-in-cheek title that references their Scottish (Och) and Jewish (Oy) heritage. And while the bawdy and risqué two-man cabaret is not formally scripted, the pair does tend to sing the same songs and hit the same beats with an undeniable chemistry, feeding off each other's energy on stage. The show features musical direction by Henry Koperski.
